

Farmer's field day at Salhakheri, Muzaffarnagar District, UP

Indian Agricultural Research Institute (ICAR-IARI) New Delhi organized Field day program on “Potential and Prospects of precision farming technologies” at village Salhakheri, Block Baghra, Muzaffarnagar on 05th January, 2016 sponsored by Precision Farming Development Center (NCPAH), Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare. More than 270 farmers from the village attended the program. Officials from KVK, Industry and State government attended and interacted with the farmers on the issues of importance of precision farming technologies in agriculture and their role for enhancing the productivity with savings of resources.
