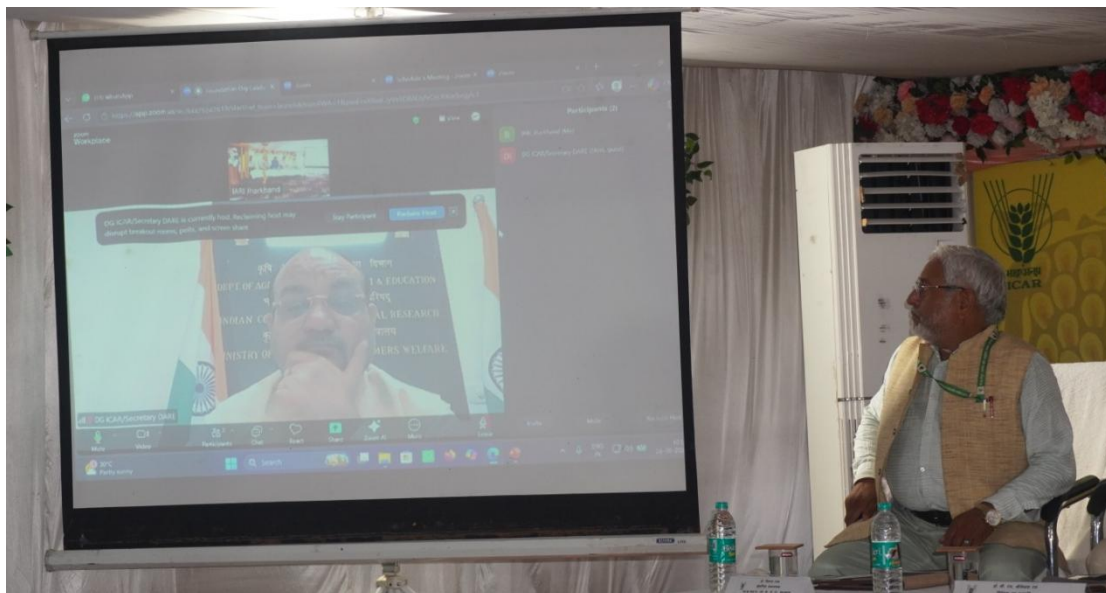


Indian Agricultural Research Institute (ICAR-IARI) celebrated its 12th Foundation Day

The Indian Agricultural Research Institute (ICAR-IARI) celebrated its 12th Foundation Day with joy and dignity at the Gauria Karma campus in Jharkhand. On this occasion, the Institute's achievements in agricultural research, education, innovation, and technology dissemination were highlighted.



The program began with a welcome address by Dr. S. K. Mahanta, Campus In-charge. The Chief Guest, Dr. M. L. Jat, Secretary, Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE) and Director General, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), virtually addressed the ceremony and extended greetings on the Foundation Day. He appreciated the
