About the Course

Agribusiness in India is a sunrise sector that has gained prominence in recent years. Availability of raw materials, changing lifestyles and relaxation in policies has given a considerable push to the development of agri industries. Agri industry bridges the gap between the rural farmers and industrial segment for higher income and market led extension. India faces critical skills shortage in the agribusiness sector as per several reports and studies. These critical shortages threaten the ability of the agricultural industry to continue to grow and respond to rising national demand for quality food and agricultural services. It is imperative to make this sector more lucrative to young farmers whereby they see it as progressive and modern fulfilling their aspirations.

Developing agrienterprises and skill development among farmers is need of the day to pave the way for sustainable evergreen revolution. To develop farmers as agribusiness manager, it is needed that they are empowered to identify technologies, business opportunities, extract benefits from support system and build theirs ventures. The present course is designed to train master trainers of National Agricultural Research System with this background.

Objectives

- To sensitize the participants about issues, concepts and constraints of developing agribusiness led by farmers.
- To equip the participants with essentials skills to launch and manage agribusinesses.

Course Content

The course will highlight the significance of taking up agriculture as entrepreneurial venture, newer opportunities viz. Who can Apply?

The candidates should possess Master's Degree in Agriculture and allied subjects and should be working in the rank of Assistant Professor or equivalent in the concerned subject under Agricultural Universities, ICAR Institutes, KVKs. and Central/ Deemed Universities.

Training Style

The training style will be participative and action oriented. The emphasis will be on learning through experiences. Group work, simulation games, role play etc. would be the major interactive modes.

Course Faculty

The course will be conducted in the overall supervision of Dr. Premlata Singh (Head). The course team comprises of Dr. J. R.
